

TDIF 2024 holds the following expectations for participation in the festival.

- To consistently take responsibility for myself about how, when and if I choose to interact with others. I will reach out to the Response Team if I need support or help.
- To contribute to a culture of consent by using full body listening and paying attention to the multiple ways that someone can signal yes or no.
- To not engage in discriminatory behaviors towards others including: violence, sexual harassment or assault, offensive comments or behavior related to sex, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, disability, mental illness, physical appearance, body size, age, race, religion, nationality, lifestyle choices and practices, including those related to food, health, parenting, and employment.
- To exercise awareness about how identity, background, and experience level can create complex dynamics that affect people's ability to proactively indicate or verbally say "no" to interactions. Therefore, I will strive to ascertain through someone's words or body language if they want to dance with me or not and respond accordingly. I will not assume that people want to be touched or do contact in any specific way just because they showed up for this event.
- To refrain from moving the sensual practice of CI toward the sexual during classes or jams at the festival.
- To engage respectfully if a concern is raised about my behavior, to address my behavior, if necessary, with the Response Team, which may include, the request to leave the immediate space or the entire event if the Team determines that my continued presence poses a risk to the safe enjoyment of the festival for other participants.
